Christmas Comes Early: Rotary Christmas Basket Seeks Host Families

For volunteers, Christmas comes early. Choirs start preparing their music, food banks start collecting holiday food supplies and the Orangevale Rotary Club starts finding the angels in our community that will supply another family's Christmas.

Orangevale Rotary Christmas 'Basket' Program: Russ and Lorie Rheams, of the OV Rotary Club, connect donor host families anonymously with families in need to supply their Christmas. Their hunt has begun to find host families for each receiving family.

"We really want to help those families that fall through the cracks of other programs," L.Rheams says. "The ones who have enough to squeak by each month, but not enough for Christmas, seniors on a fixed income who might be overlooked."

Host families select the size of family they can adopt and provide grocery items for Christmas dinner, modest gifts for each child, a small gift for each parent and a few extras, like tooth brushes and lunch supplies for the two weeks children are out of school. Connections are Continue To Page 9

HONORING ALL WHO SERVED



Folsom residents will honor the nation's veterans at the 23rd annual Wayne Spence Folsom Veterans Day Parade starting at 9 a.m. Saturday, November 11.

The parade stages in the Target/Home Goods parking lot and begins on East Bidwell Street near Montrose Drive. The parade will travel westbound on E. Bidwell Street, northbound on Coloma Street, and proceeds to Natoma Street. The event wraps up with a brief ceremony to honor local veterans at the Veterans Memorial in City Lions Park.

The Folsom Police Department will coordinate a temporary closure of all lanes of traffic on

East Bidwell Street from approximately 8 to 11 a.m. Natoma Street from Coloma to Wales Drive will close from approximately 9:15 to 11:15 a.m. Closures will be lifted immediately after the parade ends. Detours around the parade will be marked; motorists are encouraged to take Riley and School streets as alternate routes.

More than 2,000 participants will take part in this year's parade, including floats, classic cars, horseback riders, color guards, and a variety of community groups. The parade is held rain or shine; for more information call 916-461-6615 or email tocampo@folsom.ca.us.



2023 LEGISLATIVE RECAP: THE GOOD, THE BAD, AND THE UGLY

The 2023 legislative session officially came to an end this month as the Governor's deadline to sign or veto bills passed on October 14, 2023. In total, this legislative year saw 1,046 bills land on Governor Newsom's desk and he signed 890 of them into law. Here is a summary of the good, bad, and ugly legislative outcomes in 2023 that will go into law in January:

THE GOOD

SB 14 (Grove) - Combating Human Trafficking

This hard-fought piece of legislation will make human trafficking of a minor a serious felony in California. Many may find it hard to believe that it wasn't already, but prior to this bill passing this crime did not fall under our state's Three Strikes law. After passing with unanimous bi-partisan support in the State Senate, SB 14 was killed in the Assembly Public Safety Committee earlier this year. Thanks to enormous public pressure and bipartisan outcry, the committee re-voted and rightfully moved the bill forward.

SB 799 (Portantino) - Vetoed by the Governor

This bill to provide unemployment insurance benefits to striking workers passed out of the Legislature despite a strong coalition of opposition. Thankfully Governor Newsom refused to sign it into law stating in his veto letter that "now is not the time to increase costs or incur this sizable debt." The state's unemployment insurance (UI) fund is currently over \$18 billion in debt to the federal government. California employers are on the hook to pay back this loan after years of mismanagement by the state, a problem the Legislature refused to fix when it had a budget surplus. SB 799 would have further exacerbated the situation with our UI system.

Many Bills Harmful to Public Safety Defeated



Sometimes good news comes in the form of defeating bad bills. A number of bills that would have made our communities less safe were killed at different stages of the process. These included legislative efforts to defund school resource officers (AB 1299), ban the use of police canines (AB 742), prohibit consensual searches (AB 93), prohibit enforcement of low-level infractions (SB 50), expand eligibility for early release from prison (SB 81), allow parole consideration for criminals sentenced to life in prison (SB 94), and allow felons to vote from prison (ACA 4).

THE BAD

Lack of Progress on Fentanyl Crisis

Putting a stop to the fentanyl crisis that is killing over 100 Californians per week, including high school students in our community, needs to be one of the state's top priorities. While the Legislature did pass a number of bills relating to fentanyl education, it failed to increase penalties on the dealers trafficking fentanyl into our neighborhoods. They even killed a bill I coauthored to require Naloxone (medicine that rapidly reverses an opioid overdose) in every school. Much work remains to be done to address this crisis and I look forward to pushing for greater change in the coming year.

Failure to Reform Proposition

At the beginning of the legislative year, I introduced AB 75 to reform Proposition 47 and restore some accountability in our criminal justice system. Prop. 47 (infamously named the "Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act" when it passed in 2014) reduced a number of felonies to misdemeanors and contributed to an increase in retail theft across the state. My bill would have

brought back harsher penalties for serial theft offenders, but it was defeated in the Assembly Public Safety Committee along with other efforts to reform Prop. 47.

Passed Legislation that will Cost Consumers

The Legislature passed two minimum wage bills that will further increase the cost of living for California families. AB 1228 creates a \$20 minimum wage for fast food workers, while SB 525 creates a \$25 minimum wage for healthcare workers. The latter bill will result in increased healthcare costs for consumers, while potentially decreasing healthcare access in the parts of our state where hospitals are already struggling to stay afloat.

The Ugly

Taxpayers Under Fire

The Legislature simultaneously passed a constitutional amendment to reduce the vote threshold for local tax increases (ACA 1) and a constitutional amendment to increase the vote threshold for passing taxpayer protections (ACA 13). No matter how high our taxes get in California, it never seems to be enough. Instead of making it easier to increase taxes in our state even further, our Legislature would be wise to get a handle on its propensity to overspend. Voters will have the opportunity to make their voice heard on these measures at the ballot box in 2024.

It is an honor to be your representative and I look forward to continuing the fight for policies in the Legislature that protect the interests of the families, taxpayers, and small businesses in our community.



It's not too early to think of holiday cookies! My good friend from college was traveling with me recently and she mentioned the cookies that all her friends and family love. I was lucky that she wanted to share her recipe. These cookies are delicious. They require a few more steps, but the result is a cookie that tastes like it came from a fancy bakery!

Kathy's Brown Butter Bourbon Pecan Chocolate Chunk Cookies

Pecans:

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ cups pecan halves, finely chopped

2 TBSP unsalted butter

Melt the butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add in chopped pecans and cook, stirring occasionally, for 4-5 minutes, or until lightly toasted. Set aside.

Browned Butter:

2 sticks unsalted butter, melted until browned

Melt this butter in a saucepan over medium heat. Cook the butter, swirling the pan occasionally. Keep watching the butter. The top of the butter will become foamy with popping noises. When the butter turns amber color and has tiny bits on the bottom with a nutty aroma, then remove from heat and pour into a medium mixing bowl.

Cookies:

2 ½ cups all purpose flour
1 tsp salt
½ tsp cinnamon
½ tsp baking soda
1 tsp baking powder
1 cup dark brown sugar,
packed
½ cup granulated sugar

2 tsp vanilla extract

3 Tbsp bourbon

2 large eggs, room tempera-

8 oz semi sweet or dark chocolate, roughly chopped into chunks

Combine flour, salt, cinnamon, baking soda and baking powder; whisk to combine

In a large bowl with a mixer, combine melted brown butter and both sugars and beat on medium speed until combined for about 1 minute.

Add in the vanilla and bour-

Add in the eggs beating after each

Using a spoon or spatula, fold in the flour mixture just until flour disappears. Then fold in the chocolate chunks and the pecans.

Cover and refrigerate for 4 hours

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line baking pans with parchment paper. Roll into balls or use a cookie scoop and bake for 12 minutes. Let cool on pan for 15 minutes and then transfer to cooling rack.

Continued from Front Page anonymous, with code names on a shopping list for each host family. Hosting a 4 person family ranges \$200-\$250. Some families as large as 12 or more.

The response of those receiving such love from their community really says it all, says L.Rheams. "Our most heartwarming family last year was a single mother of three who had escaped a violent situation. She was so grateful she jumped out of her car to give me a hug and with tears on her face, asking me

to pass her love on to her host family."
