OVparks Community Tree Lighting Local School Celebrated Ruby Bridges Walk To School Day


Golden Valley Orchard School joined 1600 schools around the country this year, as they celebrated Ruby Bridges Walk To School Day: A Day of Dialogue. Students in grades one through eight walked from their school at 6550 Filbert Ave., Orangevale to the Divine Savior Church at the corner of Filbert and Greenback. The church graciously offered to let the school use their back parking lot to gather and hold an assembly honoring this modern hero.

Ruby Bridges was just six years old when she was forced to face adversity, fear and danger. In 1960, Ruby was one of a few Black girls selected to attend schools that were previously attended by only White students. She was the only one who went to her particular school, and because she did, not one of the White families wanted to send their children to school anymore. In fact, only one teacher agreed to stay and teach Ruby.

Ruby had to be escorted to school each day by federal marshals due to all the threats made against her. There was an angry mob gathered at the school each day - in protest of a Black child attending. Her teacher would often watch from the window as Ruby arrived, and one day she thought she saw Ruby stop and talk to the mob. When she asked Ruby about it, Ruby explained that she had forgotten to pray when she left her house, so she did it then. She prayed for God to forgive them, because even though they were heinous, she thought they did not really realize what they were doing.

Ruby showed such courage, forgiveness and confidence - at six years old! We can all learn from her, and this Day of Dialogue reminds us to speak with people, and listen.

We should strive to understand them, even if they are different. The values of Golden Valley Charter Schools values are reflected in this sentiment. 

ANTHONY LANDIS AND THE MISSING ARTIFACTS

The Landis family moved to Orangevale one year after the colony was started, 1889. They built a house at 9001 Central Avenue and the site is now the Orange Vale Water Company. The parents Leonides collected items and Lovicy had four children. They were all married but only Charles had children.

The family had a number of business interests which included: horse dealers, cattle on acreage on Cardwell Colony land, and real estate. They even considered building a dam and selling water to the bay area. Son Charles was an engineer and was involved with the building of Folsom Dam.

Leonides collected items relating to agriculture, the Gold Rush, and native tribes. His son Anthony continued

graphs exist showing many such artifacts. Their pathway at the home was made from Sutter mill stones. In 1899 they had a steam powered car and still drove it in 1941 and other artifacts such as the table where California was signed into statehood! Other examples included: James Marshall's death certificate, a wagon, ox yokes from the Donner Party, a Pony Express saddle bag, a hose cart from Placerville used in Gold Rush and a 20 Mule Team Borax Wagon. These are just some of the items he was known to have in his house and barn.

In 1939, the Golden Empire Centennial Celebration was held in Sacramento. An old Gold Rush town was built. Anthony and his brother Charles loaned a number of items to this huge project which celebrated the arrival of John Sutter in California.

Anthony continued collecting artifacts and historic documents throughout his life. They became experts on area history and shared information with anyone who wanted help. In 1957, only Anthony and his sister were living and Anthony put some items up for sale. In 1963, he died leaving a nephew living in New York as the only surviving relative. He was not interested in the property in Orangevale or what was in the buildings.

In a newspaper article, an article can be found where two youths were arrested and charged with robbery from the property. The property was simply abandoned for many years and the barn burned down. We have heard kids of the town even if scared did enter. The fate of the artifacts is unknown. Does anyone have any knowledge of visiting the property or possess a Landis artifact. The Orangevale History Project would love to hear from you and would be very grateful!

Note: When the presentation was posted on YouTube, a former resident now living in Alaska contacted us and has papers and artifacts he found in the house in his youth, and he will be sending us.

Casa Roble Players Leave It All on the Field in Thrilling Championship Victory

In a gripping display of heart, sIn a gripping display of heart, skill, and determination, the Casa Roble Rams truly left everything on the field in their stunning 23-22 victory over Twelve Bridges in the Division Five Championship. The fourth quarter was where the true spirit of the Casa Rams shined bright. Connor Campbell's 8-yard rushing touchdown, followed by an extraordinary 2-point conversion pass to Ethan Horner, who bravely played despite a groin injury, epitomized the team's grit. This play not only showcased Horner's remarkable resilience but also marked a turning point in the game.

In the final minutes, the Rams' defense, including a crucial sack by Darren Dalton, held strong

against the formidable Twelve Bridges offense, ensuring that Casa Roble maintained their slight lead until the final whistle.
