

Grocery Stores of Orangevale - Part 4 9396 Greenback Lane (Current home of 7 Eleven)

The early 1950's was a busy time of competing grocery market's opening in Orangevale. Vance Market and the Orangevale Mercantile were already in business. Opening as the third new grocery, Jet Market on the corner of Main & Greenback, had its grand opening on April 21, 1951, by co-owners Stuart Schwab and H.J. Samuelson (aka "Sam-the Liquor Man"). Schwab was a veteran grocery man who formerly owned stores in Amador and Placer counties and he was a manager at Safeway for many vears. Samuelson was the former owner of Pacific Liquor in Folsom. Jet Market was described as being ultramodern, having walls lined with refrigeration equipment and including all your onestop needs - meats, dairy, produce, liquors, and frozen foods. The sure-to-please bargains included bacon - 47c per lb., coffee - 79c per lb., 2 heads of lettuce - 17c, and a carton of cigarettes - \$1.42.

In August of 1951, an amusing column involving robbery, kidnapping and the true facts was published by the editor of the Folsom Telegraph. Apparently, Sam and a young helper were alone in the store with the week's receipts in the register. Two occupied cars were spotted around the 9pm closing time and one of the occupants knocked on the door saying he wanted to make a phone call. The request was turned down and upon leaving the store the youth noted that when Sam drove away, a car pulled out and appeared to be following him. The worried youth went to the home of Schwab to report what he saw and after several calls went unanswered at Samuelson's home, the sheriffs were called out and word spread that Sam had been kidnapped. After several hours and the story growing, Samuelson came

back and was indeed victimized. He got tied up in a canasta game and did not get home until 3am.



In February 1952, Walter C. Keller became a partner with Stuart Schwab in the ownership and operation of Jet Market and the partnership with Samuelson was dissolved. Keller had 25 years of grocery experience managing stores for Safeway and Purity. This new partnership was shortlived as Sam Samuelson came back and purchased, with a silent partner, full interest in Jet Market in July 1952. This same year, the market was plagued as a small sum of cash & merchandise resulted in heavy damage during a burglary in September and again in November, a theft of close to \$3,000 took place. The later burglary included an impromptu celebration at the back of the store where empty whiskey and water bottles were found.

In 1953, many improvements were made including a new safe, lighting and the "latest scientific store traffic plan" to control customer flow and create a meal planning path. The market also signed a union contract with the AFL food clerks.

Due to failing health and doctor's orders after major lung surgery, Samuelson sold Jet Market to 3 partners in early 1954: Woodrow (Woody) Lee, Jack Bloom and Shelton P. Bentley. They invested in the community because they liked it and were impressed with its potential for growth.

The market got a major facelift in 1957 with a planned \$100,000 expansion including building additions with a much larger meat department and additional refrigeration units. The 1958 expansion grand opening sale included salmon steaks - 69c per lb., ice cream - 69c per ½ gal., avocados - 2 for 29c and Hills Bros. coffee - \$1.39 for 2 lbs.

In 1960, an additional plan to develop a ten acre super shopping center was planned not only to improve the su-



permarket but add additional buildings to attract other retail businesses for a complete shopping at one location experience.

In 1962, another change of ownership occurred when Jet Market owners sold to the Van Horn brothers, Andy, Charles and John to open Vans Market. Opening day specials included Crisco - 69c for 3 lb. tin, chuck tuna - 5 cans for \$1, flour - 25 lb. bag for \$1.79 and 8 oz. meat pies - 5 for \$1. Vans remained in operation until 1977.

In 1983, Wild Sports opened at this location and remained in business until 2018 and 7 Eleven opened in 2022. Since the 1950's, many businesses and owners have shaped the property at the southwest corner of Greenback Lane and Main Ave which still serves the community today.





Nikki Pulley, a teacher at Ottomon Elementary, was talking about getting ready for Thanksgiving and having to set aside some extra time to make her grandmother's roll recipe.

Her grandmother, Mook, was known for her baking skills and this recipe came to her through the Better Homes and Gardens Bread book. At family events, she would have to make multiple batches so there would be enough for all the cousins to have 3 or 4 each. Nikki learned how to make this recipe in high school and now she makes multiple batches each year to feed the family on Thanksgiving.

MOOK'S ROLLS

Ingredients

- 4 1/4 cup 4 3/4 cups bread flour
- 1 Tablespoon active dry yeast
- 1 cup milk
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1/3 cup butter, margarine or shortening
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 whole eggs, at room temperature

cooking oil

Instructions

- 1. Put 2 cups of flour in a mixing bowl or bowl of stand mixer.
- 2. Add the yeast and salt.
- 3. Scald the milk, butter, and sugar in saucepan. Let cool 'til lukewarm. Crack eggs and add eggs to milk mixture.
- 4. Pour egg mixture into the flour mixture and mix well. All this mixture to sit or "sponge" for 10 minutes.
- 5. Using a dough hook with the stand mixer, add the rest of flour, one cup at a time until dough clings to hook and almost cleans the sides.
- 6. Touch the dough lightly. Add more flour if dough sticks to your fingers and knead for 3-4 minutes. Dough should be soft, smooth, elastic, wet, and not sticky.
- 7. Scrape down sides of the bowl, lightly oil the top of your dough, and cover it with plastic wrap.
- 8. Allow dough to rise to double in size in a warm, draft free place.
- 9. Divide dough into 2 equal balls. Cover and allow dough to rest for 5 minutes. Shape as desired (we like crescent roll shape) into 24 rolls total, and place on lightly greased baking sheet.
- 10. Cover and allow to rise for 20-30 minutes.

Bake in a preheated 375°F oven for 12-14 minutes or until golden brown.



CASA ROBLE WINS IN QUARTERFINALS: A TESTAMENT TO STRENGTH AND STRATEGY

In a remarkable showdown in the Sac-Joaquin Section Division V quarterfinals, the Casa Roble Rams demonstrated their formidable prowess with a decisive 46-18 victory over Lathrop. This significant win not only underscores Casa's impressive 10-1 season record but also highlights the team's resilience and strategic mastery.

The standout performance of the night was delivered by quarterback Connor Campbell, who, with 7-of-12 passing for a commanding 190 yards, led the team to three first-half touchdowns. Head Coach Chris Horner's strategy of building a robust team around a powerful line, with players weighing in at a staggering 260 to 353 pounds, played a pivotal role in the Rams' victory.

Horner proudly acknowledges, "We've got some big boys. They do their job in the weight room, and it shows on the field."

The game's intensity escalated in the second half, with Lathrop increasing their physicality. Despite the heightened emotions typical of playoff games, Lathrop's approach led to consequential penalties that hindered their comeback efforts.




