
their own front yards with their fire pits and friends. It was a sight to behold and a night to remember!

The Rise and the Fall of John Cardwell

John T. Cardwell came from Ireland in the 1840's. He travelled from New York to California via the Panama Isthmus. John was interested in the Gold Rush and worked at mining from 1848 to 1855. By 1871, he became a United States citizen and in 1872, married Mary Howe in Folsom.

Whilst living in Ashland, he became a poll worker for the Mississippi Township. Cardwell took his collected road toll taxes for District 5 (used to keep the roads in good repair).

He had become a landowner in 1870 buying 160 acres. By 1892, owned large chunks of land eventually sold part of it to the Orange Vale Colony. He removed the oak trees from his land providing him with 90,000 cords of wood. In addition, he found use for the rocks from

the Gold Rush. He was quite an entrepreneur. Eventually he had been unable to transport the wood on the river as he had planned, and it went up in flames, but he was insured. Was said to be navigable.

In 1882, he bought Daisy, a paddle steamer. The American River was said to be navigable. He planned to bring the VIPs from Sacramento to Folsom and back, but the 12th street bridge was too low, and the boat had to be carried over land. Cardwell took his case that the river was supposed to be navigable to court. The Supreme Court declared the river to be seasonal and not navigable.

In 1890, he built a mansion at 12th and M in Sacramento. Pictures show a large, beautiful home in the area of many others of the time. It was torn down in 1935. His family is believed to include two children.

By the 1880's there was a need $\,$

to break up the large grants to attract new people and businesses. In 1887, Cardwell started selling pieces of land. The Orange Vale Colonization Company was formed by a group of six investors. They were able to advertise and divide the acreage. It was planted into orchards and had water available for irrigation. He decided to start his own colony. Cardwell had no investors and borrowed money from Crocker Bank. He had no secure water and no public relations. His colony was north of Oak Avenue stretching from Hazel Avenue to west and Mountain Avene to the east. The land did not sell as he planned and went into foreclosure. He was basically bankrupt.

In 1890. He endorsed a malaria cure which failed. He started drilling for gold in the 1890's near the Placer County line. In 1894, he was given a cease-and-desist order for mining a tunnel under Leidesdorff Street in Folsom. Downhill he went all the way! In 1907, he was in a brawl in a tavern in Natomas and in 1908 he died in a cabin El Dorado County.

Cardwell Colony still appears on maps today with a number of parcels.



Every year my mother-inlaw would make dozens of cinnamon rolls for the family. My sister-in-law took up the duty for several years, but now it is up to each of us to make our own. I am sharing the recipe so that you can start the tradition in your familv. One batch is enough for a regular size family. Read through the recipe and plan for the time. It takes a bit of time to complete. but the results are amazingly delicious! Hopefully, this will be a new tradition in your family!

Edna's Cinnamon Rolls

2- 9 x 12 or 9 x 13 pansmakes 24 cinnamon rolls total

2 Packages yeast- if using bulk, then 1 pkg=2 ¼ tsp yeast (for a total of 4 ½ tsp veast)

½ cup water (110 degrees) 1 ½ cup milk, lukewarm

½ cup shortening

34 cup granulated sugar

2 tsp salt 2 eggs, well beaten

5-7 cups sifted flour ½ cup flour to work with, if divide in half kneading by hand

Make the Dough first. When it has almost dou-

bled in size, then get the

pans and filling ready.

Filling: ½ cube softened butter, ½ cup granulated sugar and 2 tsp cinnamonyou will divide butter and sugar mixture in half for each dozen.

In bottom of pans: ½ cube softened butter, ½ cup brown sugar, a few tbsp granulated sugar and 2 tsp cinnamon (may need to add more sugar mixture to make sure pans are covered)- this is divided in half for each pan.

Note: If you feel the need to add more butter, then do so sparingly. It doesn't make them better, but you might need more to cover the pan or spread on the dough.

Dough:

1. Combine yeast with water. In mixer or another bowl, combine milk, shortening, sugar, and salt

2. Add yeast and eggs

3. Stir in 2 cups flour, then add enough flour until easy to handle. Turn out onto lightly floured board or use mixer to knead.

If using mixer, knead until dough sticks to dough

4. Place in greased (oiled) bowl, turn dough over so all gets oiled

5. Cover with a towel and let rise until doubledabout 1½ to 2 hours. It is done when impression in dough remains.

6. Punch dough down and

7. Roll each half into a rectangle 15 x 9 inches

8. Spread softened butter over each rectangle, then sprinkle all over with cin-

9. Roll starting with narrow edge, seal end by pinching along length of

10. Cut into 12 slices. I usually cut in half and then half each half and so

11. Spread softened butter in pans and sprinkle with brown sugar mixture -be sure all is covered

12. Cover and let rise until doubled- about 30 minutes 13. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 25 to 30 minutes.

14. Immediately turn over onto foil so that all the sugar and butter that was on the bottom is now at the top. Let cool. Then wrap in foil and freeze or eat. Enjoy!

Note: We usually warm them in the microwave for about 10 seconds and then plop a bit of butter over the top.

HELP BRING LOCAL TEEN HOME

Whiseant Family Prepares Home, Vehicle for Now Quadrapledic Son By Patsy McGavock

When life hits hardest it can seem very alone. Yet community and the combined good will of others often turn a sought for miracle into tangible fact. Life hit hardest for Brian Whiseant, of Orangevale, when a rural car accident on Oct 22 left him quadraplegic at 19 years old. His parents, Amanda and Chester Whiseant, are facing the harsh financial realities that follow; funds they do not have to modify their home and vehicle to meet Brian's current needs, so he can come home to their care instead of a long term care facility.

The Whiseants are a typical Orangevalian family. Mom and dad working through the highs and lows of life, raising 4 children ages 11 to 21 and choosing life in the mix of rural small town and suburb that defines Orangevale. Dedicated to the communities surrounding their children, they volunteer in sports teams, children's ministries and the local homeschool community. They are a family with typical Orangevale heart facing untypical challenges.

Brian was born in Yuba City, Ca. His family moved to the Or-



angevale area when he was 11, where he enjoyed baseball, Civil Air Patrol and youth mission trips. His interests grew into a love for the outdoors and working with his hands. Drawing, playing and building guitars, hiking and fixing cars used to fill his days.

He was living independently working in solar sales, until Oct 22. Driving home from his grandparents in Marysville, he lost control of his car in rainy conditions. It flipped, landing in an orchard. Brian sat with a broken neck for two hours, until

a passerby saw the car and investigated.

"Brian is lucky to be alive. For me, this shows God has a plan for him. He's not done yet," says Amanda. However, it is a life altering event. For Brian and for his parents as they bring him home, taking the role of full-time lungs stable from collapse. Keeping his thoughts from a depressive mindset and fears at bay. She shares "We are in a weird phase. A hard phase. I'm glad that I am not in it alone. We have been circled by church family, family, and friends." Cards, drawings and encouragements have let Brian know he also is not alone.

Now comes a step of practicality. How do you outfit your vehicle

aren't trying to do anything fancy. We are trying to give Brian the love, support, and care that he needs. This is a family emergency that we are not able to financially shoulder on our own."

While Brian is at a rehabilitation facility for 6 or more weeks, friends of the family are setting up an online crowdfunding page for medical emergencies, with a link soon forth coming.
