

#### OVFO FOODBANK'S SECOND ANNUAL SPRING COMMUNITY DRIVE-THROUGH FOOD DRIVE



OVFO Foodbank's Second Annual Spring Community Drive-through Food Drive, With A Twist Start A Neighborhood Bag Collection

The Orangevale Fair Oaks Food Bank is calling all neighborhood heroes to reach out, fill a bag and bring a collection of food to the Second Annual Spring Community Food Drive on March 9, hosted at the food bank from 9am to 12 noon.

Last year's community collaboration focused on community organizations and churches collecting food in house with their membership. This year there's a twist. The food bank is calling all residents not just to bring food, but to unite themselves — neighborhood by neighborhood- in mini neighborhood food col-

lection drives. Maybe only ten neighbors at a time, each filing a bag. Ten by ten the bags add up to hundreds, and soon the food bank shelves fill.

Foodbank volunteers have made it easy to get involved. Download a neighborhood flyer and print enough for your immediate neighbors. Distribute the flyers to your neighbors, inviting them to fill a bag and leave it on their porch for you to pick up at the time and date you indicate on the flyer. Then, the first week of March, pick up the bags and deliver your trunkful of neighborhood donations to the food bank on March 9th.

inspiring this year's approach. Two truck-loads of small grocery bags sporting brightly colored flyers showed up, all invitations accepted by neighbors of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints near Deseret Ave in Fair Oaks.

One delivery last year really stood out,

"It was incredible. It was exciting," says Patsy McGavock, the volunteer inspired by the event to begin promoting neighborhood led drives. "I read the flyers to see what it was all about. How had they collected so much?" She learned that the church had followed a Boys Scouts of America model of neighborhood collection — and it had worked.

"What I learned is that while not all can give much, many can give a little – and lots of little bits adds up to so much," says McGavock. But it takes someone to start it, just a few people willing to ask their neighbors. "And it multiplies. Multiplies! The evidence was in those trucks," McGavock concludes.

"Amazing!"





Assembly District 7 faces a homelessness crisis that demands more than just policy - it requires a leader with compassion, understanding, and a proven track record. Porsche Middleton embodies these qualities, presenting a stark contrast to Josh Hoover and YK Chalamcherla. Her direct involvement in housing initiatives speaks volumes of her commitment to not just managing but solving homelessness through community-focused efforts.

While Hoover and Chalamcherla offer perspectives on fiscal oversight and support for statewide initiatives, respectively, neither presents the hands-on, comprehensive approach that Middleton does. Her strategy promises not only to address the immediate needs of our homeless population but also to tackle the underlying causes, ensuring long-term solutions in a fiscally responsible way. Unlike Hoover and Chalamcherla, Porsche has already shown her strategies work - by passing the first affordable supportive housing project in her community, helping deliver job training to atrisk youth, and moving hundreds of people into housing.

For a leader who prioritizes action over rhetoric and community wellbeing over superficial measures,



#### Mark Aring Presented History Person of Year

The Orangevale History Project named Mark Aring as this year's History Person of the Year at a recent general meeting. Mark was honored for his dedication and accomplishments. He was one of the 29 people who are charter members as he was active in helping develop the organization.

He was elected the first President in March 2022 and with his board of three other members and a few appointed positions along the way intense planning meetings happened monthly. He still continued with his monthly presentations on various Orangevale history subjects starting with the historical homes. In these presentations have you noticed the

details he provides? This detail involves hours of research in old editions of local newspapers such as the Folsom Telegraph and more recent in The View and in a few cases the Sacramento Union and Bee. Also, many historical libraries and including visiting people in the community. We thank you for all the hours you spent on researching and preparing the presentation.

These were just a portion of where he spent his time. Pushed us to apply for our non profit status which we received within five months. To apply we needed to have by laws which met an early goal. Having funds for our projects quickly became one of the priorities. His first project was the Trail sign for the Orangevale railroad located in Orangevale

Park. He studied routes and visited different sites for local berms. He had faith we would get the funds and had the map and information ready for printing when they were located. He then worked with the sponsors to get it installed at the park on a trail close to the park's berm.

Of course, as President, he could not do it all and just had a way to request people to help whether as an officer or a member or a community helper. No way could we cover all the different undertakings so I will mention just a few. Possibly one of his biggest accomplishments of the Museum. Starting late in the first year, rumors were heard of the park wanting to provide a building for us. Making inquiries and attending park board meeting the contract was

agreed too and we got the keys in April 2023. Work began on renovation of the building and was accomplished with help from the community with flooring. paint, and othdonations. During this time Mark and others worked on developing the museum displays Oran-The

gevale History Museum opening on July 15, 2023, will forever be credited to his presidency. Mark is currently in his second term as President and still moving the group forward.

#### Prop 1: A Tale of More Empty Promises By Sue Frost

As we navigate through the heart of election season, with ballots distributed and, I hope, making their way to the Election's Office, we stand on the cusp of the March 5 Primary Election. It's a pivotal time for our community, and I feel compelled to share my thoughts on Proposition 1, slated for the March 2024 ballot. This measure, which proposes a \$6.4 billion bond aimed at enhancing mental health treatment and housing, presents several concerns in our ongoing battle against homelessness in California.

While the initiative's provision for 6,800 treatment beds and 4,350 housing units, including dedicated support for veterans, is noteworthy, it doesn't fully meet the needs of the estimated 180,000 homeless individuals in our state. Of all the state's dysfunctions, none is more damaging to California's attempts to "make the pitch" to tax payers than the State's worst in the nation homelessness.

California's homelessness crisis is a glaring challenge, one that Proposition 1, despite its good intentions, might not fully address. It seems to focus on a specific part of the problem, potentially leaving many in need without adequate support.

A concerning aspect of Prop 1 is its mandate for counties to use 30% of their Mental Health Services Act funds for housing. This could significantly cut into the budget for crucial mental health services, especially for preventing homelessness and providing early mental health support. In Sacramento, where resources are already stretched thin, this could lead to a decrease in vital services. One has to wonder, why hasn't the original Mental Health Services Act of 2004, funded by a tax on millionaires, been able to curb our mental health and homelessness issues?

Adding to our challenges, Prop 1's implementation, particularly in financially strained counties like ours, could be difficult. Redirecting funds might mean cutting back on other essential services, compromising the quality and reach of mental health care.

While building new facilities and homes is important, Prop 1 misses a key piece: ongoing support services like job training, education, and continuous mental health care, all critical for successfully helping homeless individuals reintegrate into society.





Moreover, Prop 1 doesn't fully consider the varied needs of the entire homeless population, which includes diverse groups like families, youth, and the elderly, many of whom don't suffer from severe mental health conditions or substance abuse issues. We need a broader strategy that addresses the unique challenges faced by all homeless individuals.

While Proposition 1 demonstrates a commitment to addressing homelessness and mental health issues in California, it is not a comprehensive solution. The state needs a more holistic approach that includes a broader range of services and caters to the diverse needs of all homeless. individuals. This should include not only funding for treatment beds and housing but also investment in preventative services, workforce development, and long-term support mechanisms. Such an approach would ensure a more sustainable and effective solution to the complex issues of homelessness and mental health in California.

I do believe in reform, redemption, and rehabilitation. However, for a real change to occur, it's crucial for politicians and their activist partners to shift their focus from unchecked spending to taking decisive, early actions such as enforcing basic laws. This approach could have significantly slowed the homelessness crisis.






