An editorial of interest: The con in solutions to the unhoused

The title is "Crocodile Tears for the Houseless: A pretext for rescinding adopted zoning and environmental laws."

Excerpt: "There is no shortage of cons in American society, and it is hard to find a bigger one than the claim that homelessness, rent gouging, and overcrowding result from a housing shortage. City Hall's solution, therefore, is to "unleash the private sector" by eliminating zoning laws and environmental review to build more housing. While these faux answers tremendously benefit real estate speculators, they invariably boomerang. Homelessness continues to rise despite a building boom of expensive apartments.

"The real causes of the housing crisis, increasing poverty and a shortage of low-cost housing, get worse. Nevertheless cities, like LA, shower the real estate industry with endless deregulation of their investment schemes. The outcome is expensive housing, typically high-rent, high rise apartments. While they increase the housing supply, they also make housing more unaffordable. Older, cheaper housing is demolished and then replaced with new, pricev buildings that also lift the price of existing housing." The author is a former LA

It wouldn't occur to you at first glance, but Orangevale was an odd little crossroads. It was a farming community, and the people were mostly God-gearing Christians of one flavor or another, and those facts alone lumped us all in the same basket. But each person brought with them a unique and different story. While everyone was engaged in a singular economic effort, we were all here for a different reason.

Annie Munsterman was a lady farmer. She had a little house that she shared with her mother and her own orchard. At the crack of dawn, Annie marched down to the orchard in her sunbonnet, long dress and sturdy shoes which were stitched Litke baseballs. We called them "Mammy Yoakum" shoes. If any woman was going to make it on her own, without a man, it was Annie Munsterman.

Annie brought to this pastoral life the hard instincts of a pioneer. She was single-minded, self-sufficient and tough, enduring the hardships of physical labor thought well beyond a woman's capacity to accomplish. She cultivated and planted. She picked, sorted, and packed long after most others would have called it a day. She climbed up and down ladders and pruned with the best of them. She was a whirlwind of energy, constantly on the move. When she walked (and she walked everywhere), no one could keep up with her. Had she lived 100 years earli earlier in Indian territory on the Great Plains, she might not have stood out. Here and at this time, where gentility and social graciousness were the order of the day, Annie was an amusing, unpredictable oddity.

Annie didn't care a hoot

about social conventions and so routinely broke the "rules" that cinched women into narrow roles. But the rules were changing. Women were becoming "loose" and bobbing their hair, which was quite scandalous. They were learning to drive and venturing out beyond their front gate and into areas where men traditionally had gone. Well, this suited Annie just fine, and Daddy came home one evening and announced with a laugh and a shake of his head that Annie Munsterman had "just bobbed her hair and bought a 'car." Well you can bet, she didn't do it either because it was stylish; for Annie it was just plain practical. But it was amusing to think that Annie Munsterman and\*the most unflappable flapper now had something in common. Maybe it was just that Annie's values were timeless and came and went in popularity. And it was just coincidence that, in the 1920s, her independence was coming back in style.

som and was badly burned while washing clothes which had previously been washed in gasoline. From 1929 a number of articles in Orangevale appear frequently with her attending many social events with Ella Landis, Vena Barthlomew, Betty Davies, Mrs. Charles Wilson, and Elsa Fox are just a few.

ASSEMBLYMAN JOSH HOOVER INTRODUCES LEGISLATION TO STOP THE PROLIFERATION OF FENTANYL IN SCHOOLS

Assemblyman Josh Hoover (R-Folsom) announced the introduction of groundbreaking legislation to address the alarming rise of fentanyl in California schools and communities. Assembly Bill 2045 would increase penalties on fentanyl crimes involving minors and add sentence enhancements for criminals who traffick fentanyl within 1,000 feet of school grounds.

"Our number one job as lawmakers should be protecting our most vulnerable from harm," Assemblyman Hoover said. "We must do more as a Legislature to create a safe environment where our children can learn, grow, and thrive. This bill sends a clear message that those who endanger minors and bring deadly fentanyl into our schools will face severe consequences."

AB 2045 would classify fentanyl in the same category as other dangerous illicit drugs and would give prosecutors new tools to hold dealers accountable.

Key Provisions of the Proposed Legislation:

- 1. New penalties on the sale of fentanyl to children: The bill seeks to add an additional 2 years to the sentence of any adult who solicits, induces, encourages, or intimidates a minor with the intent that the minor commits a drug crime. If passed, this felony offense will be punishable by 5, 8, or 11 years in state prison.
- 2. Sentence enhancement for fentanyl-related offenses



on or near school grounds: Brings fentanyl in line with other drugs like heroin or cocaine in cases where the offense occurs upon or within 1,000 feet of school grounds by adding a 2-year enhancement to the sentence of those who solicit, encourage, or intimidate minors to commit these drug crimes. This enhancement aims to create a safer environment for students attending public or private elementary, vocational, middle, or high schools during school hours or related programs.

3. Additional punishment for trafficking fentanyl on or near school grounds: Adds fentanvl to the list of illicit drugs already covered under state law for drug trafficking offenses on or near school premises. For adults committing specified drug trafficking offenses within 1.000 feet of a school, the legislation adds an additional punishment of 3, 4, or 5 years. Furthermore, if the offense involves a minor who is at least four years vounger than the defendant. an extra enhancement of 3, 4, or 5 years applies, subject to realignment.

Josh Hoover represents Assembly District 7, which includes the cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, and Rancho Cordova and the unincorporated communities of Carmichael, Fair Oaks, Foothill Farms, Gold River, Mather, McClellan Park, North Highlands, Orangevale, and Rosemont.






