From its humble beginnings in Manchester, today Inner Wheel's presence has expanded globally, with clubs in over 100 countries and 120,000-plus members.



Orangevale Post Office History (1930 -1954)

Continued from precious published articles.

Succeeding William F. Jeffs, who was carrier on Folsom Rural Route #1 for 19 years, George Thomas Johnston (Tom) was appointed rural mail carrier on the Orangevale Route in January 1930. ing Tom Johnstons annual vacation or due to rare illnesses, E.C. French was the primary substitute carrier, however there is record of other substitute carriers including Mrs. Alma Binning and Mrs. Maxine Ross. Orangevale had 150 mailboxes in 1930.

In 1947 - Rural Route 1 from Folsom to Orangevale

was reported as being the second oldest rural route in the United States.

In 1950, as the Orangevale area's need for a post office was being assessed, two petitions circulated for the naming of the post office, one with the name of Kingsley. However, most residents protested the name Kingsley so a second petition with the name Orangevale was also circulated. All petitions and appraisals of the area had been submitted to the postal officials in Washington, D.C. and the decision on location and naming for the proposed post office would be made public by about March 1, 1951.

In May 1951, the Orangevale Post Office was set

up in the Orangevale General Supply store on Hazel near Greenback Lane, immediately behind the Orangevale Community Clubhouse. The official opening had long time resident Mrs. Martha Bost sworn in as postmaster with Mrs. Mildred Birks assisting. It was opened as a fourth-class post office. The post office offered stamp, package and money order service. Several requests for first day cancellations were eagerly waiting for the Orangevale cancellation stamp to arrive from Washington.

Starting in April 1954, residents house numbering was changing, and they were instructed to learn their house number and observe what direction the carrier took on route past their house so that their mailbox could be placed on the correct side of the street. Due to the increase in mail volume, it was predicted that the Orangevale Post Office would get a second-class rating. At that same time, Vernon Cable was contracted by the government to construct the new 30 by 80-foot concrete block post office building adjoining the west end of the Orangevale Department Store. Upon completion of the new post office site, the rural route that served Orangevale for more than 50 years would officially be transferred to the post office.






