

DIVERSE BY DESIGN, PART 2: CREATING COM- FORT IN UNCERTAINTY

Last time, we explored a vivid image of intentional community-building—relationships formed with people unlike you in age, culture, education, or work. Those connections create networks that expand and intersect across the community in beautiful, often unexpected ways. Skills, ideas, mentoring, and support move more freely—even to those with fewer personal ties.

But these relationships rarely begin in comfort. A game plan helps. To bridge that gap, I've gathered practices and stories from people stepping into the unfamiliar—with intention.

Acknowledge Feelings: Discomfort doesn't mean you're doing something wrong—it often means you're doing something meaningful. Focus there: How can I be present and open to learning?

Ask questions with respect. "Why do you do that?" can become "Would you mind if I asked about...?" or "I'm curious, if you're open to sharing."

You don't have to pretend to be comfortable to create safety. Naming your uncertainty can ease pressure and open the door to connection: "I'm not sure how to say this, but

I want to try."

Define Terms, Clarify: We often assume shared meaning. Intentional clarity prevents misunderstanding. If a term feels uncertain, ask: "What does that mean to you?" Or when asked something yourself, try: "Why do you ask? So I can best answer."

Different perspectives, even disagreement, don't have to cause disconnection. It broadens our understanding. Acknowledge: "I see this differently, and I value this conversation."

Let Silence Work: Normalize pauses. They allow reflection and signal respect. A simple "I'm thinking about that" or "I'm digesting that" shows you're engaged. Silence can also help you track fatigue or steady emotions when a conversation feels intense. New ideas can challenge us—even when intentions are true.

Know Your Capacity: Connection takes presence, and presence takes energy. Tuning into your physical cues helps you know when you've reached capacity. It's not failure—it's feedback.

Acknowledge it, then gratefully end with purpose: "Thank you for sharing with me," or "Let's keep this going another time." We often remember how conversations end more than how they begin.

Two Stories, Many Lessons: Linda Miner, of the Orangevale Women's Club, answered a flyer for ENGIN, a program connecting English speakers with Ukrainians through weekly video calls. "My conversations with Ksenia make me more compassionate and grateful," Linda shares. "We live in a diverse country, but I don't often interact intentionally with people who are different. Knowing Ksenia makes me more

open to doing that."

She now better understands Ukrainian cultural cues—like how reserved public behavior and careful presentation reflect pride and respect, not distance. Her confidence has grown, too. "Now I don't think about it—I just do it. Even a passing comment can feel good. It makes me feel part of a bigger world."

From experience, I've learned that stretching outside my norm - consistently - builds my comfort in community.

I once read that in the U.S., men who wear turbans are 99% likely to be practicing Sikhs—and recently learned from local Sikhs that the turban is, in part, a public declaration of their commitment to serve and protect others as children of God.

Now, when I see a turban in the park, I feel quiet reassurance and gratitude for that person in my community.

The Path to Belonging

These practices won't guarantee ease, but they do build capacity. That capacity becomes a bridge—growing into that beautiful network of glistering intersections.

Belonging often follows presence—not the other way around.

As Rumi wrote, "There is a field beyond right and wrong. I'll meet you there." Let's meet each other there—even if uncertain; open, and ready to grow.

Next issue: Intergenerational opportunities and the importance of connecting across age.

Teena Stern Named History Person of the Year

Teena Stern, Archivist, for the Orangevale History Project has been voted 2026 History Person of the year. She was honored for her outstanding dedication to the Orangevale History Museum.

A retired state Archivist, Teena began her volunteer work with the Citrus Heights Historical Society and the City of Citrus Heights when she was introduced to the opening of the Orangevale History Museum and was soon asked, to help us determine how to identify and oversee the artifacts being donated by the community.

She soon started establishing the Orangevale Archives and working diligently there. She meticulously has identified, tracked and stored all the artifacts donated. Teena wrote the Collection Policy and the official forms required for archival development.

In preparing for the museum Teena secured the popular Ladies in White exhibit from Citrus Heights. She then asked who would be creating the rest of the display? Answer was You. Teena stepped forward. She has since been developing new exhibits every six months since. The displays have grown from one room with a couple of cases to two full rooms and seven cases with various wall

and floor displays.

Teena's contributions extend far beyond managing the Archives. She is a constant at all museum events and planning, shares her knowledge with members and visitors, organizing rooms and files, serving as a docent, leading archive tours.

The Orangevale History Museum is deepest grateful to Teena Stern for her exceptional dedication, tireless service in preserving Orangevale History.

SUSIE'S CHOCOLATE SCOTCHAROOS

- 1 cup sugar
 - 1 cup light Karo syrup (corn syrup)
 - 1 cup creamy peanut butter
 - 6 cups Rice Krispies cereal
 - 1 cup milk chocolate chips
 - 1 cup butterscotch chips
- Grease a 9 x 13 pan with butter, set aside. In a 3-quart

pot, mix sugar and syrup together. Stir until sugar dissolves and it begins to bubble. Immediately remove from heat and add peanut butter, stirring well. Then add the cereal and stir until it is blended. Press this mixture into the 9 x 13 prepared pan.

In a microwave safe bowl, melt the chips together, stirring well. Pour over the top of the cereal mixture. Chill for 1 hour for chips to set. Take out and cut into bars. Enjoy!




